After starting his career in accounting with KPMG, Keith earned a CPA, then began his distinguished security industry career in 1991; first at Wells Fargo Guard Services, and then at U.S. Security Associates from 1993 to 2014, as a shareholder and where he rose to president of the New York Metro and Aviation business units. From its early days, Keith played a central role in the company's explosive growth, helping lead it to \$1.2 billion in annual revenue before it was acquired by Goldman Sachs and later Allied Universal.

Keith founded Security ProAdvisors in 2015, where he combined his operational expertise and financial acumen to help security companies enhance profitability and achieve greater valuation. In 2024, he co-authored Legends of the Security Services Industry: Profiles in Leadership, a testament to his dedication to honoring the pioneers of the field he loved so deeply.

Keith's legacy is defined by leadership, integrity, innovation, and a lifelong commitment to excellence. He will be deeply missed by his colleagues, friends, and the industry he helped shape.

- 2. A separate activity sheet explaining any school and community activities include details of each activity
- 3. A list of any job/work you have held
- 4. A copy of standardized test score ACT or SAT if taken (optional)

SCHOLARSHIP PRIZE: \$3000 scholarship to be awarded to the chosen student applicant.

PROCEDURE:

The application must be fully complete and submitted to Craig Schwab at craigschwab1977@gmail.com on or before October 1, 2025.

A letter of recommendation must be submitted with your application on or before October 1, 2025. This letter may be from an employer, guidance counselor, teacher, mentor, community leader or other non-family member who can personally attest to the attributes which will be evaluated for this scholarship award.
